## **Background Information**

The mission and vision of William James College (WJC) is to provide an experiential education for its students and to diversify the field of psychology for the surrounding community. Consistent with this mission, WJC extended this same vision to the field of education through the Center for Behavioral Health, Equity and Leadership in Schools (BHELS). Our Leadership Licensure Program/Graduate Certificate in School Leadership Program (LLP/GCSL) is a workforce diversity initiative. Our first and current cohort of graduate students in our school leadership program as well as WJC doctoral students who participate in selected courses designed for school leaders, are racially diverse, include career changers, and identify as first- generation graduate students. For example, 50% of students in the first cohort of GCSL are black. Our first cohort of graduates can be seen here. BHELS has first-hand knowledge and skills regarding pipeline development along with program management and expert facilitation skills to develop a well-prepared workforce to meet the educational challenges of our time.

## **Teacher Diversity Professional Learning Community (TD PLC) Grant**

In the fall of 2023, WJC/BHELS was awarded and presented year 1 of a 3-year renewable grant, totaling 1.175 million dollars, to offer professional development to diversify the educator pipeline by leading the Teacher Diversity Professional Learning Community (TD PLC) in collaboration with the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). Over 100 districts across the Commonwealth are enrolled.

## **Program Components**

- Professional learning on how to diversify the work force
- Individualized coaching
- A follow up data webinar to assess and track implementation and progress
- A focus group session to gather feedback and insight
- A wellness guide focused on teacher well-being as it relates to school climate and culture; a retention strategy

### **Professional Learning and Support**

- The conference will include nationally recognized speakers to build the capacity of leaders who serve at the very top of educational institutions.
- Expert coaching to district teams. District teams must be willing to be coached with another team and share data.
- District teams must be willing to be paired with another school district for 1 coaching session and the data webinar as this will be offered as follow-up support.

#### Participants will:

- Have access to national experts on creating the conditions for transparent conversations about race and educational equity.
- Have access to local experts on organizational change and reform that leads to improved outcomes for all students.
- Receive expert coaching from national and local experts.

### Related outcomes include:

- Understand the research and underlying challenges to teacher diversification recruitment and retention including root causes and data-based resources to address these challenges.
- Organizational theory to understand one's own district from multiple perspectives.
   Participants will explore the environment and whether it attrats high quality diverse talent. This will entail organizational design principles that intersect with social justice leadership, equity and social dominance.
- Utilize adult social emotional competencies to reframe practices that allow for connection, belonging and authentic engagement, and how to pilot and scale new learning. This added layer of planning will give participants a road map to enhance existing practices.
