Joan Wallace-Benjamin

Doctor of Humane Letters, *Honoris Causa*

Joan Wallace-Benjamin joined The Home for Little Wanderers in 2003 as President and Chief Executive Officer. Under her guidance, the agency has gained prominence in the field of child and family service providers, becoming a leader in innovative programming for underserved populations and expanding its advocacy role for all children.

Previously, Wallace-Benjamin was President and Chief Executive Officer of The Urban League of Eastern Massachusetts for 11 years. Immediately prior to joining The Home, she served as a Consultant with Whitehead Mann, a global executive recruiting firm. She has also served as Director of Operations for Boys and Girls Clubs of Boston; Deputy Director of ABCD Head Start, and a Research Analyst for ABT Associates.

Wallace-Benjamin took a short detour from The Home in 2007 when she answered Governor-Elect Deval Patrick's call to serve as Chief of Staff on his transition team and in the first months of office. Wallace-Benjamin has brought to all of her positions a remarkable array of skills and energy that have empowered and inspired the organizations to fulfill their missions of service, research and advocacy.

She has received awards too numerous to list in full, but a sampling includes Connected 100 Most Influential People of Color in Boston, Boston Magazine's 50 Most Powerful Women, the Henry L. Shattuck Public Service City Champion Award, Urban League Civil Rights Award, Pinnacle Award, Achievement in Management Non-Profit from the Boston Chamber of Commerce.

Wallace-Benjamin graduated from Wellesley College with a BA in Psychology and received her PhD from the Heller School for Social Policy and Management at Brandeis University. She holds Honorary Doctorates from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst (1993); Newbury College, Chestnut Hill, MA (2005); Curry College, Milton, MA (2009); Bridgewater State University (in May 2011), and New England Law, Boston (May, 2013).

Wallace-Benjamin is a member of the Board of Trustees for Bridgewater State University and a former Trustee of Wellesley College and former member of the Board of Overseers for The Heller School for Social Policy & Management. Additionally she has been a Corporation Member of Northeastern University and a Trustee of Pine Manor College, and served on the board of Cityfresh Foods, Inc.

Wallace-Benjamin is married and has two adult sons. She and her husband Milton live in Dedham, MA.

Lyndia Downie

Doctor of Humane Letters, *Honoris Causa*

Lyndia Downie has been Pine Street Inn's President & Executive Director since 2000. As a result of her leadership and vision, Pine Street is now the largest provider of permanent supportive housing for formerly homeless men and women in New England. During her tenure, Pine Street Inn has more than tripled its inventory of permanent supportive housing and now has nearly 900 units of housing. This has helped reduce the number of homeless individuals on the streets in Boston by over 30 percent and the shelter numbers by 18 percent. Within the past several years, her efforts have led to a strategic decision to decrease a limited number of Pine Street's shelter beds and convert resources to permanent supportive housing. This was the first time that shelter beds were closed in Boston due to decreased demand as a result of placing greater numbers of people in housing.

With her keen understanding of the complex causes of homelessness and proven methods to combat it, Downie is a frequently requested speaker and regularly serves as a policy advisor at the city, state and federal level. She serves on Mayor Martin Walsh's Advisory Council on Homelessness. She is a member of the Board of Directors at Metropolitan Boston Housing Partnership, Massachusetts Housing and Shelter Alliance and the Massachusetts Council of Human Service Providers.

Downie earned her BA from the University of Vermont. She is a recipient of the Boston Chamber of Commerce Pinnacle Award and the Boston Municipal Research Bureau's City Champion Shattuck Award. She is also a Barr Fellow.

Augustus A. White, III

Doctor of Humane Letters, *Honoris Causa*

Augustus A. White, III, MD, PhD, was the Orthopaedic Surgeon-in-Chief at Beth Israel Hospital in Boston, MA, for 13 years. Today, he is at the Ellen and Melvin Gordon Distinguished Professor of Medical Education, Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery at Harvard Medical School (HMS).

Dr. White has served as a Professor of the Harvard/MIT Division of Health Sciences and Technology and Director of the Oliver Wendell Holmes Society at HMS. He is currently the Director of the Culturally Competent Care Education Program at HMS.

A graduate of Stanford Medical School, he went on to complete an internship at the University of Michigan Medical Center, a general surgery residency at Presbyterian Medical Center San Francisco and an orthopedic residency at Yale Medical Center. Dr. White then joined the US Army Medical Corps serving in Vietnam and was awarded the Bronze Star. Following his Military service, he studied at the University of Gothenburg and at the Karolinska Institute where he obtained a PhD in research on the biomechanics of the spine.

Upon his return to Yale he became a full Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery and Director of the Engineering Laboratory for Musculoskeletal Disease, which he co-founded and developed. Over the years, he trained 25 spine surgeons in the Daniel E. Hogan Spine Fellowship Program, which he directed. While his professional life has drawn him to classroom, laboratory and lecture hall, he is most committed to direct patient care. Stimulated by a desire to better meet the challenges in health care management, he completed the Advanced Management Program at the Harvard Business School.

White is an internationally known, widely published authority on biomechanics of the spine, fracture healing and surgical and non-surgical care of the spine. Most noted among his publications is the highly regarded definitive work, *The Clinical Biomechanics of the Spine*. He is also acclaimed for his writing on cultural competency in health care. His widely recognized book titled *Seeing Patients: Unconscious Bias in Health Care* is among a number of acclaimed publications on this topic.

Throughout his career, White has committed himself to issues of diversity, and is nationally recognized for his work in medical education and issues of health care disparities. He is the founding President of the J. Robert Gladden Orthopaedic Society, an organization dedicated to the enrichment of diversity in the orthopedic profession. In 2006, White was presented the Diversity Award by the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons and in 2010, the same organization honored him with the William W. Tipton, Jr., MD Leadership Award for outstanding leadership in orthopedics.
